Competence targets

The aim of the teaching:

- 1. The student has knowledge the principles of organic growth
- 2. The student has knowledge of different types of growing methods in sustainable horticulture and agriculture
- 3. The students can recognize most common pests in plant production
- 4. The student has knowledge of the ecological principles underlying biological control.
- 5. The student knows the advantages and disadvantages of using biological control.
- 6. The student can explain strategies for biological control of pests and the principles of the individual strategies.
- 7. The student can combine theoretical knowledge with practical skills in organic growth and biological control

Roskilde Cathedral has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1995. With its many unique royal chapels the Cathedral reflects the changing European architectural history acrosss 800 years and is an early Scandinavian Gothic cathedral built in bricks. A World Heritage site is a monument or place that has important significance in the history of mankind. Today more than 1000 sites are inscribed on the World Heritage List by UNESCO, including the Pyramids, the Great Wall of China and Grand Canyon.
